Maths Expectations:	Practise all times tables and related division facts for continued fluency and speed

Topic Tasks

Please pick activities to complete with your family. Homework should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have with your family is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

Choose a book you like and rewrite it as a comic. <i>English</i>	Create your own character for a 'Goth' novel. Draw a picture and write a character description. <i>English</i>	Choose your favourite book and prepare a presentation to persuade the class to read it. <i>Reading</i>
Work out the perimeter of your living room and create enough Halloween bunting to decorate it. <i>Maths</i>	Use your addition and subtraction knowledge to meal plan for a week, draw up a shopping list and stick to a budget. <i>Maths/PSHE</i>	Visit the National Space Centre in Leicester. <i>Science</i>
Find out 5 things that the Anglo-Saxon's didn't have and live a day without them. <i>History</i>	Research Anglo-Saxon villages and create a model of a typical home. <i>History</i>	Create a model of the solar system out of any material you like. <i>Science</i>
Make 3 different types of paper plane and test which one is better. What makes it better and why? <i>Art & DT</i>	Make a playdough model, design a backdrop and create a stop motion video for the Battle of Britain. <i>Computing</i>	Use a map to find and explore the Anglo- Saxon, burgahl defences of Wallingford. <i>Geography</i>

There is no right or wrong way to complete the tasks. Take as long, or as little, time as you like. A large project may take a number of weeks.
