### Essentials

<b>Reading Expectations</b>	10 minutes daily: read to an adult or read independently and talk about it with an adult; this should be recorded in Reading Records (by adult or child), books should be in school daily.
<b>Maths Expectations</b>	5 minutes <i>Times Tables Rockstars</i> daily: play on Garage and Studio to develop fluent recall of multiplication tables and gain a Rock Star Status!
<b>Spelling Expectations</b>	If you have been set spellings to learn, please set aside 10 minutes twice a week to do this. If these are all completed then you may choose to practise new spellings from the Year 3 and 4 spelling list which is on the class website page.

### Optional Topic Tasks

- Choose a different activity to **do with your family each week**. There is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like; large projects may take a number of weeks.
- When you have completed a Topic Task, share it with us via email, photo or video or bring in a piece of writing, scrap book or artwork and you will be rewarded with house points in recognition of your efforts!

<i><b>Geography/English</b></i> If you could only take 3 things to the Antarctic, what would you take with you and why?	<i><b>English</b></i> Draw a picture and label it/write a description of a scene from 'The Pugs of the Frozen North' OR Write a diary pretending to be an explorer in the Antarctic. What did you do? How did you feel?	<i><b>Reading</b></i> Read some poetry and find a poem to practise reading at home and then perform to the class.
<i><b>Maths</b></i> Have a go on TT Rockstars, we are going to be giving out certificates and rewards!	<i><b>Reading</b></i> Write a summary of a book you have read recently and enjoyed. Who are the main characters? Where is it set? What are the main events?	<i><b>RE</b></i> Find and read a story from the Bible where someone has to make a moral decision. Can you retell the story or draw a scene from the story?
<i><b>Science</b></i> Research how crystals are formed, can you draw and label different types of crystal?	<i><b>Geography/English</b></i> Write a paragraph persuading a person to visit Antarctica. Tell them all the good things about Antarctica.	<i><b>. Maths</b></i> Can you create your own secret code using numbers? Each number should represent a letter, use this code to create your own secret messages
<i><b>DT/Art/Geography</b></i> Create a model or a picture of a scene from Antarctica.	<i><b>Science</b></i> Can you be a palaeontologist?! Research which kinds of fossils have been found on the Jurassic Coast in England	<i><b>PE</b></i> Get your heart racing by doing at least 10minutes of exercise every day. Try skipping, football, dancing, walking up and down the stairs... even cleaning works up a sweat!

Occasionally, additional homework tasks may be set to prepare for or follow up on classwork; when these are required, information will be emailed to parents.
