Age Appropriate Homework Expectations

Young children learn most effectively through fun, 'hands on' learning and experiences shared with you. Please see below for suggestions of activities that you and your child could enjoy together. Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks

Please pick activities to complete with your family. Homework should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have with your family is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

Share a story together. Talk about what you can see in the pictures. <i>C&L/Lit</i>	Learn and sing nursery rhymes together. <i>C&L/ Lit/ EAD</i>	Give your child little jobs to do (for example, helping to set the table or tidy up). <i>PSED</i>
Visit the park and encourage your child to choose a new or different piece of equipment/ set a challenge for your child. <i>PD/PSED</i>	Go for a walk and look for print in the environment such as road and shop signs and door numbers. Talk about what they mean. <i>Lit/Maths</i>	Paint a fence or wall with water and large paintbrushes. <i>PD/Lit</i>
Choose a colour and find objects of that colour around your home. <i>Maths</i>	Listen to different types of music. Dance together! <i>EAD</i>	Visit your local library and help your child to choose a range of books (fiction and non – fiction) that you can enjoy together. <i>Lit/UW</i>
Spend time together looking at your child's baby photos. Talk about how they have grown and changed. <i>PSED/C&L/UW</i>	Sing number songs together – for example: '1,2,3,4,5, Once I Caught a Fish Alive' and 'Five Little Ducks Went Swimming One Day.' <i>Maths/EAD</i>	Explore the natural world together – look for signs of seasonal changes. Make collections of conkers, pine cones etc for counting and sorting. <i>UW/Maths</i>

There is no right or wrong way to complete the tasks. Take as long, or as little, time as you like. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher via Seesaw or print them out to show the class.

Additional learning may be sent home as appropriate.
