### Age Appropriate Homework Expectations

<b>Phonics Expectations</b>	Phonics will start within the first half term. Children should practice orally segmenting words into syllables, identifying initial letter sounds and alliteration for a minimum of 10 minutes per day. This can be spread throughout the day. You can find useful videos and information about phonics on our website
<b>Reading Expectations:</b>	Read for 10 minutes each day and record your progress in your Reading Record. This can be a mixture of you reading to your child(ren) and them telling you a story using pictures. Rereading books is highly encouraged. Reading Records should be in school every day and will be checked at least once a week
<b>Maths Expectations:</b>	Match items and identify differences, sort items into groups, compare groups (mass, volume and quantity) Explore patterns, identify and continue repeating patterns, create own simple patterns. Explore numbers 1-5. For 10 minutes per day.

*Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.*

### Topic Tasks

Please pick activities to complete with your family. Homework should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have with your family is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

Draw a family portrait <i>PD/PSED/C&amp;L/EAD</i>	Read a story in a strange place <i>C&amp;L/Lit</i>	Visit a library. What new books can you find? <i>Lit/PSED</i>
Use things around your house to create a repeating pattern. <i>Maths</i>	Use empty bottles and jugs to explore capacity. <i>Maths</i>	Look at pictures of your family from when they were younger. What is different about them now? How are they different to you? <i>PSED/C&amp;L/UtW</i>
Go on a seasonal walk. What can you see in the environment? <i>UtW/C&amp;L</i>	Learn to, or practice, writing your name. <i>PSED/Lit/PD</i>	Create an obstacle course to complete with your family. <i>PD/PSED</i>
Create an "All About Me" booklet or poster. <i>PSED/Lit/C&amp;L</i>	Create your own story to share with your family. <i>PSED/C&amp;L</i>	Play a board game with your family/friends. <i>PSED</i>

There is no right or wrong way to complete the tasks. Take as long, or as little, time as you like. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher via Seesaw or print them out to show the class.

Additional learning may be sent home as appropriate.
