Age Appropriate Homework Expectations

Spelling Expectations	Practice common exception words for 10 minutes 3 x a week List of words can be found on the class pages of the school website
Reading Expectations:	Read for 10 minutes each day and write in your Reading Record. Please refer to age appropriate 'Reading Fluency Skills' on the class pages of the school website
Maths Expectations:	10 mins, 3x a week: Recall all small number pairs up to and including 10 (e.g. all pairs that make 7, 8 etc) Count on and back from 0 in 2s, 5s and 10s. Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words

Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks

Please pick a different activity to **do with your family each week**. Completing your homework with your family should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

There is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like on these tasks. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher or print them out to show the class.

Create a map of the River Thames in London, naming the bridges and key landmarks <i>Geography</i>	Create a top ten interesting facts list about London <i>English</i>	Create some London-themed addition and subtraction word problems (and solve them!) <i>Maths</i>
Design and/or make an outfit for Paddington Bear to wear on his next visit to Buckingham Palace. <i>Art/DT</i>	Find out about the different forms of transport that are used in London. Present your findings in any way you choose <i>Geography/English</i>	Write a poem about London (think about the sights, sounds and smells) <i>English</i>
Create a piece of artwork to represent a famous London scene or landmark (you could use collage, paint, pens, pencils...anything you like!) <i>Art</i>	Visit London and write a diary of your time there. What did you see? What did you do? What did you enjoy about it? <i>English</i>	Create a portrait of the current king or a previous monarch <i>History/Art</i>
Find out about wildlife in London. Which creatures live in the city? What is their habitat like? Present your findings as a habitat in a shoebox, or in another way of your choosing <i>Science</i>	Create a model of a famous London building or landmark <i>DT</i>	Compose your own piece of London themed music using instruments or objects from home <i>Music</i>
