Spelling Expectations	Practice spellings for 10 minutes each day Age appropriate words can be found on the class pages of the school website
Reading Expectations:	Read for 10 minutes each day and record your progress in your Reading Record. Reading Records should be in school every day and will be checked at least once a week. Please refer to age appropriate 'Reading Fluency Skills' on the class pages of the school website
Maths Expectations:	Count, read and write numbers up to 100 in words and numerals. Count in steps of 2, 5 and 10. Number bonds to 10.

Topic Tasks

Please pick activities to complete with your family. Homework should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have with your family is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

Write three facts about your favourite animal. Don't forget your capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. <i>English</i>	Write ten silly sentences using the year one common exception words. <i>English</i>	Read some nonfiction books and see if you can identify the different features. <i>Reading</i>
Create a number line to 20, and represent some number sentences: 13-1,16 + 1,15- 2, 18+2 ect <i>Maths</i>	Draw different representations for the numbers 11-20 using tens ones (draw tens frames, part whole models, base ten ect) <i>Maths</i>	Explore your outside environment and observe what animals you can see. Can you make a poster to say which animal group they belong to? Science
Make a timeline of your life so far. Add in the important dates, for example when you were born, when you started school. <i>History</i>	Can you design an animal enclosure for zoo animals in a shoe box? DT	Research Mary Anning and why she is important. <i>History</i>
Create a 3D sculpture of your favourite animal. <i>Art</i>	Who is special to us? Create a mind map with pictures about the people who are special to you. <i>PHSE</i>	Can you find five facts about Rio de Janeiro and share them with the class. <i>Geography</i>

There is no right or wrong way to complete the tasks. Take as long, or as little, time as you like. A large project my take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher via Seesaw or print them out to show the class.
