Topic Tasks

Please pick a different activity to **do with your family each week**. Completing your homework with your family should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

There is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like on these tasks. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher or print them out to show the class.

.Research a world river (not the Thames, Yukon or Nile!) <i>Geography</i>	Make a fact file or a game (e.g. Top Trumps) about rivers around the world <i>Geography</i>	Choose a river (not the Yukon) and compare it to the River Thames <i>Geography</i>
Explain the water cycle <i>Science</i>	Investigate how long it takes for a small amount of water to evaporate. Think about how to do this scientifically <i>Science</i>	Create your own game using Scratch <i>Computing</i>
Create an information page or leaflet about Lent <i>RE</i>	Research an environmental issue that you are interested in e.g. plastic pollution, climate change <i>PSHE</i>	Explain your top 5 tips for staying safe online <i>E-safety</i>
Write your own short story based on How to train your dragon <i>English</i>	Choose a character from How to train your dragon and create a character profile, drawing or description of them. <i>English</i>	Sew a button onto a piece of fabric or have a go at making something by sewing <i>DT</i>
