<b>Spelling Expectations</b>	Practice spellings 15 min per day (statutory list and words identified through classwork)
<b>Reading Expectations:</b>	Read for at least 15 mins per day. Record progress in reading record You can refer to age appropriate reading skills on the class pages of the school website
<b>Maths Expectations:</b>	See weekly maths homework and feedback on any issues

### Topic Tasks

Please pick a different activity to **do with your family each week**. Completing your homework with your family should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

There is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like on these tasks. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher or print them out to show the class.

<b>Science</b> Make the solar system. A large poster with lots of extra information about different moons planets and moons.	<b>Science</b> Make a series of sketches of the moon as it changes shape over a period of a week.	<b>English</b> Find an interesting character in one of your books. How would they describe themselves if they looked in a mirror and no one was around to hear? What would they honestly say to themselves? How would they really describe themselves?
<b>Geography</b> Find out about the volcanoes that have recently erupted in Iceland.	<b>Maths</b> Work out what fraction of your week is spent doing the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• sleeping</li><li>• looking at screens</li><li>• doing exercise</li></ul>	<b>DT</b> Look at some familiar objects around your house. Can you make them using art straws? (just ask for the resources you need)
<b>Social</b> Take the time to check on some elderly neighbours. While it is cold, perhaps you could offer to put their bins out.	<b>Nature</b> Research how to make a simple 'bird feed fat ball'. The birds find it really difficult to find food at this time of year and often rely on us to support them.	<b>Music</b> Introduce your family to the following Johnny Adams tunes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Reconsider me</li><li>• Tell it like it is</li><li>• I don't worry myself</li><li>• Even now</li><li>• Please release me</li></ul>
