School Uniform Essentials

Required

- ✓ Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
- ✓ Green and white checked dress -summer only
- ✓ White shirt or polo shirt
- ✓ Green sweatshirt, cardigan or jumper – with or without the school logo
- ✓ Grey or white socks, white, grey or green tights
- ✓ Black/Dark trainers/shoes

Hair

Hair styles should be appropriate for school
Shoulder length hair must be tied back. *Hair accessories with flowers, large bows etc are not part of school uniform*

Jewellery: for safety reasons jewellery must not be worn. However, if your child has pierced ears, small plain stud earrings may be worn

Why wear a uniform? Wearing a uniform creates a sense of belonging to the CGPS community. It teaches children to dress smartly and take pride in their appearance.

Parent's role: Dressing each morning is part of preparation for the day ahead. It is important parents encourage & support this so that children are in the right mind set for learning & success.

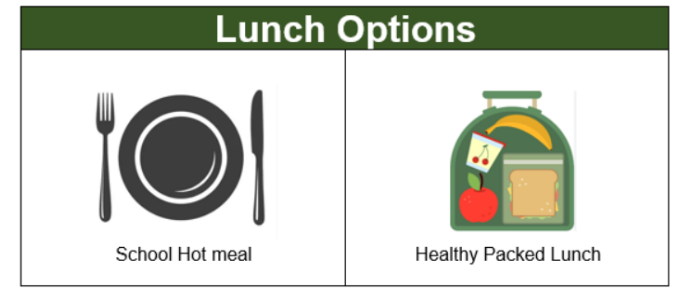

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Pupil Premium

Pupil premium is money given to schools to improve the education of children who are economically disadvantaged or children who have been in care or adopted from care. This extra funding is used to enable schools to support learning and development and improve educational outcomes.

Who is eligible?

Your child may be eligible if you receive any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Or if your child
- Is currently being looked after by a local authority in England or Wales
- Has left care in England or Wales through an adoption order, a special guardianship order, or a child arrangements order

How the money will benefit your child

School will use the money in ways they think will best support your child's learning and development and improve their educational outcomes

Service Pupil Premium

What is the Service Pupil Premium?

The purpose of the Service pupil premium The Department for Education (DfE) introduced the Service pupil premium (SPP) in April 2011 in recognition of the specific challenges children from service families face and as part of the commitment to delivering the armed forces covenant. State schools, academies and free schools in England, which have children of service families in school years reception to year 11, can receive the SPP funding. It is designed to assist the school in providing the additional support that these children may need and is currently worth £335 per service child who meets the eligibility criteria.

Eligibility criteria

Pupils attract SPP if they meet one of the following criteria:

- one of their parents is serving in the regular armed forces (including pupils with a parent who is on full commitment as part of the full time reserve service)
- they have been registered as a 'service child' on a school census since 2016, see note on the DfE's ever 6 service child measure
- one of their parents died whilst serving in the armed forces and the pupil receives a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme or the War Pensions Scheme Children have to be flagged as service children ahead of the autumn school census deadline.

Service parents need to make the school aware of their status by talking to the head teacher or school admin staff.

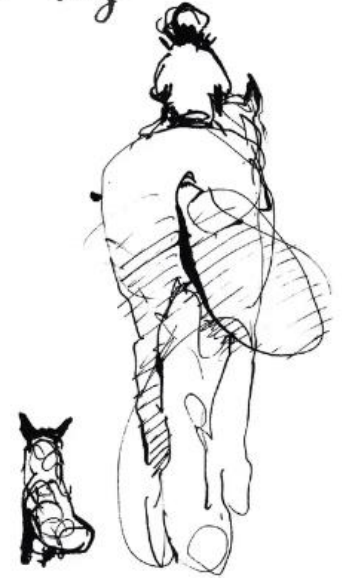

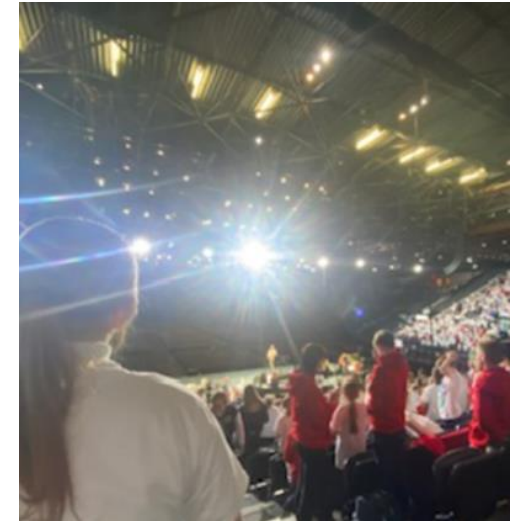
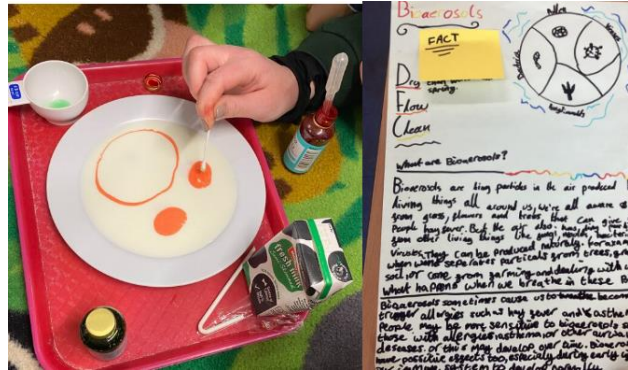

Children will bring home a reading record and reading book linked to the Phonics being taught.

Please ensure these books are brought to school each day.

We only have one copy per child and we will be reading them through the week as well as them needing to be read at home.

Reading Year 2 Onwards

Children will bring home a reading record and reading book.

Please ensure these books are brought to school each day.

Why read for 20 minutes a day?

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Safe Collection

Please make sure the office have an up-to-date list of who has permission to collect your child.

We understand that there may be times where you will need someone to collect in an emergency, if this is the case, please send an **email** the school office. Please **do not call**. This is for safeguarding reasons.



We will not allow your child to leave the classroom if we have not had confirmation from a parent or guardian as to who they are being collected by (this includes family members that we have not met before)

Attendance

If your child is unable to attend for any reason, please call school: 01491 836785

This applies to all children including Pre School

Children being in school every day and on time is very important.

Evidence shows that if a child does not attend regularly:

- They cannot keep up with their class work.
- They do not achieve the results.
- They miss out on the social side of school and can have problems maintaining friendships.

From Reception to Year 6, Children learn Phonics/SPAG, Maths & English on a daily basis. Just like the other subjects these daily subjects form part of a sequence of learning and missing lessons can impede progress and understanding.

Of course, there are times when children are not well enough to attend school.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they say they're unwell. There are Government Guidelines which can be found on our school website. Be assured we will always call you if we feel your child is not well enough to be in school.

We monitor attendance to safeguard children and will contact you if we have concerns.

Sometimes due to exceptional circumstances you may need to apply to take your child out of school during term time. You can do this by completing a form available from the school office or emailing the school office

The Headteacher will consider each application. They can only authorise absence in unavoidable exceptional circumstances.
